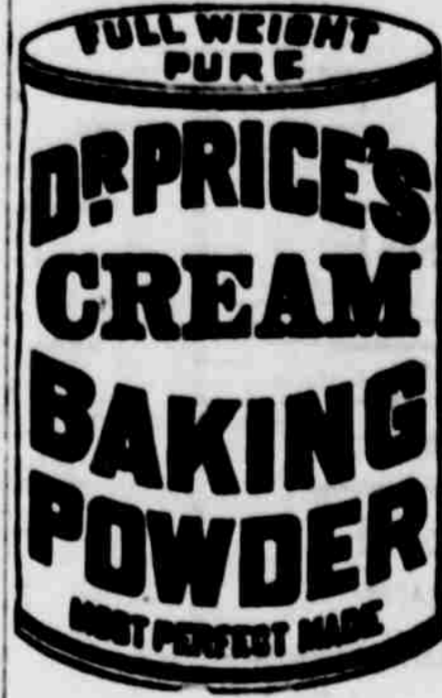

NATIONAL G. A. R. COLLEGE.

The idea of a school of this character originated in the minds of five noble women, members of the Relief Corps of this State, and culminated in their procuring a charter under the laws of the State of Kansas.

The object of this school is to give an education free of charge to children and children's children of Union soldiers and sailors of the rebellion, and to place it in a location within the reach of the children of those patriots particularly those who are struggling to redeem that portion of the country so recently described as the "Great American Desert," and who are unable, by reason of their condition and the distance from the colleges of the east and more prosperous communities to educate them that as best befits the sons and daughters of heroes of a civil war.

The Grand Army of the Republic of the department of Kansas, at its Ninth Annual Encampment held at the city of Salina on January 28th, 29th and 30th, 1890, adopted the following resolutions:

Whereas, certain ladies actuated by the principles of Friendship, Loyalty, and Charity, have organized and incorporated the G. A. R. Memorial college at Oberlin, Kansas; and

Whereas, the purpose of said college is the free education of all children of the soldiers and sailors of the late war; therefore be it

Resolved, by the Encampment, that we endorse the action of the Board of Trustees of said college, and recommend the same to the favorable consideration of all persons interested in the education of the children of the soldiers of the late war, and that in the names of the trustees of said college we say that in offering the purpose of seeking State aid.

The Women's Relief Corps, at the same time and place adopted similar resolutions, as also did the encampment of the Sons of Veterans.

Department Commander Ira F. Collins, in General Order No. 7, dated at Sabetha, Kansas, March 15th, 1890 has the following to say to the college:

Attention is hereby given especially called to the G. A. R. Memorial College, located at Oberlin, Kansas, the purpose of this institution is the free education of all children of the soldiers and sailors of the late war. It was organized and incorporated by certain noble women, actuated by the

principles of friendship, charity and loyalty. An intelligence and courage are the foundation stones upon which the fabric of our government rests, every enterprise having in view the education of our youth should receive the hearty and united support of all patriotic citizens.

The promoters of this enterprise desire to erect a building to accommodate the present needs of the school the present year, and if possible to begin the construction of the college building proper next year. To do this requires the aid and assistance of those friendly to the cause, and it is believed that all veterans and Sons of Veterans and members of relief corps as well as friends of soldiers and friends of education generally throughout the Union, will cheerfully contribute to the maintenance and support of an institution with a purpose so worthy. Will you contribute one dollar or more? If you can't then can you pay the expense of one day's tuition for one pupil? If you can't do this, can't you purchase one brick to be placed in the building? All subscriptions should be accompanied by the name and residence of the donor. If he be a soldier, his company and regiment should be given so as to be intended to keep a complete and accurate record of the names and residences of those, and to be published in book form upon the completion of the college building.

Subscriptions should be sent to L. A. Minto, Secretary, Oberlin, Kansas who will promptly acknowledge the receipt of the same.
