At Rest.

Died, at her home in Red Cloud, Nebr., Sunday morning, at one o'clock Nov., 27th, 1892, of quick consumption, Minnie Etta Hendrick, well beloved wife of Prof. George Hendrick. Minnie Etta Comer was born in Eagle Mills, Ohio, Feb. 25th, 1868. Where she lived until she was eight years old. In March '76 she moved with her parents to West Jersey, Stark county, Ill. Five years was spent there, and 3 years in Prairieville, Peoria county Ill. Again she came with her parents to Cora, Smith county, Kansas. There she was married to Prof. Geo. Hendrick, Nov. 7th, 1886. Three sweet baby boys blessed this happy union, two of which have preceded their sainted mother to the city of God.

Mrs. Hendrick came to Red Cloud, Neb., the 10th day of last Sept. She was in frail health then, and her heart was heavy with grief at the loss of her second little son, Glen, who two months previous, which loss no doubt hastened her demise. From that time until the day of her death she had the best of care, and every comfort that money could procure, and the best of medical skill, but all was of no avail, and on last Sunday night she sweetly sank to rest, with her loved ones all around her.

A few hours before she died she talked with her husband and sisters and mother who were present and bade them "good bye" and asked them to meet her on the heavenly shore. A few days before her death her sister asked her if she was afraid to die, and she answered in a clear triumphant voice "oh no, I shall meet Jesus on the other side."

And so the record is made up for Minnie of loving ministrations to all with whom she came in contact, loyal fidelity to her husband and little ones and a perfect resignation to the will of her heavenly father. To those of us who were permitted to be with her in the last few weeks of her illness it was learned that in that frail tenement of clay there dwelt a spirit as pure and as innocent as a little child's. She was beloved by all who knew her, and while our hearts are broken with grief at her loss, we know she has entered into rest, has gone to dwell with her Savior for ever more. To Prof. Hendrick and his little son, and to the father and mother and brothers and sisters, and to Mrs. Laura Hendrick, her sister-in-law, we extend our deepest sympathy, and pray for them all that there may enter into their hearts the peace that possessed hers. Last Monday morning the remains were taken to Cora, Kansas, the former home of Mrs. Hendrick, and tenderly laid her to rest to await the resurrection morn, in Cedar Hill cemetery by the side of her little boys. The funeral services were held in the Congregational church at Cora, and were conducted by Rev. Ely of Red Cloud.—Nation.
