New York will thus become the second city in the world in area and population, only exceeded by London.

**What Might Be.**  
There is talk that the B. & M. folks will soon replace the men at this point that they removed during last fall. Ordinarily we should say that the road would be compelled to do this if there is an abundant crop harvested. We believe that in the dim future, and perhaps not so very far distant, that the passenger division will be put back here. If some inducement could be made the land department of the road we believe that it would make a great difference with our division and our railroad interests. Red Cloud is naturally the best city on the Burlington's line, and also a natural division point for trains coming from Chicago, St. Louis, St. Joseph and the east. The eastern trains of consequence, from the above points, are now run by the way of Table Rock and Lincoln, a roundabout way for the purpose of helping Lincoln out, when it would be much nearer to run them to Denver via this city. Therefore if some inducement could be offered we believe the trains would be run as of yore, and the division placed where it ought to be, i. e. Red Cloud. It is natural for the road to help towns that they have the greatest interest in, which can be plainly observed if you will stop for a moment and look at Lincoln, Wymore, McCook, Hot Springs, Sheridan etc. We believe that the commercial club could find some profitable work on this line that would be of advantage to our city. Red Cloud has some excellent advantages for parks, sanitariums, etc., that could be developed with capital, that would make her the great attraction of the southwest, saying nothing about a great midway resort for invalids going westward, a half way rest as it were. Capital could make of Red Cloud, along the line suggested, what the Hot Springs are to Arkansas, and to Dakota. It has been a foregone conclusion for years, and fully demonstrated by facts that people with weak lungs should not travel directly from the eastern states to the mountains, but that there should be a stopping place at about 4000 miles east of Colorado, without the extreme altitude, yet high enough so that the persons afflicted could feel the change and not suffer therefrom, yet prepare them for a higher altitude and a lighter atmosphere. Red Cloud is therefore just the place and we believe that if the railroad company had a goodly interest here that they might take hold of the matter and help to build up, Red Cloud and other wise put us in the push. All it needs is the right kind of talk and push and the matter would be settled. Will we do it?

**The City's Duty.**  
The supreme court handed down a decision recently that gives the city the right to look after sidewalks, streets and alleys, and make it responsible for their condition. The decision says: "The fee of the streets of the municipalities of this state is vested in the municipalities themselves, and the sidewalks of the various municipal corporations are parts of the streets thereof. The law of this state devolves upon the various municipal corporations thereof the duty of at all times keeping their streets and sidewalks in a reasonably safe condition for travel by the public, and no municipal corporation by any act of its own can devolve this duty on another so as to relieve itself from a liability resulting from its failure to perform such duty. The law does not make it the duty of a lot owner to build, maintain, or repair the sidewalks being a part of his street in front of his premises. A municipal corporation may employ such agency as it sees fit in the construction or repair of its street- and sidewalks, and may license or permit a lot owner to build or repair a sidewalk in front of his premises under its direction.—Adams County Democrat.

## Chancellor MacLean's Lecture.

On last Friday evening Chancellor MacLean, the talented head of the state university, gave his lecture at the Congregational church. Owing to the lateness of the train which did not arrive until 8:30, the church was not crowded as it would have been had the lecture commenced an hour earlier; then to add to the lateness of the train, a good rain commenced to fall which kept many away. However, the chancellor in his pleasant manner arose, and remarked that wherever he had been during the last six weeks it had rained, and he thought that to be preferred rather than the lecture. After the choir had furnished some excellent music, Prof. Wilson introduced the chancellor, who for an hour addressed those present on matters that were highly entertaining. He has a faculty of pleasing his audience and holding their closest attention. He felt extremely proud of the educational facilities of Nebraska and thought that no other state in the grand galaxy of states could boast of so perfect a system, and a system where the rich and poor could have the same advantages, from the country schools, through the high schools into the state university. There was no reason why the children of the great commonwealth of Nebraska should not be educated. The speaker thought however that forced education was not the proper thing. He did not believe in the "ramrod" kind of teaching, where page after page of stuff was crowded down the gullet of the child as it were, without considering the value thereof. He did not appreciate the teacher that was only in the field for the money that was in it, for they were not fit persons to train the children. He would have teachers who taught because it was a pleasure, and who did not think so much of their salary, but those who could bear the irksome duties without faltering by the way. Upon the whole, the lecture was one of the best that we have ever heard and we believe that the regents of the university acted with great wisdom when they secured Chancellor MacLean's services. He has the right ideas about education and if the regents follow out his methods there will be no question about the Nebraska schools leading all others. It is to be hoped that he may come again to this city when the circumstances are more propitious.
