School Board Meeting
The board met in regular session at the office of the secretary on Monday evening, August 10, 1903. T. C. Harker, chairman, C. L. Cotting, J. S. Gilham, Henry Cook and Geo. O. Yeiser, Post Wilson was also present.
Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

The secretary stated that Mrs. W. A. McKeighan had presented a number of valuable books to the schools of this city which had been taken to the high school building. Thereupon the following resolutions were adopted:
That the thanks of the school board and the gratitude of the school be expressed to Mrs. W. A. McKeighan for the valuable books presented by her to the public schools of Red Cloud. Resolved that a copy of these resolutions be entered upon the minutes of this board, published in the city papers and furnished to Mrs. McKeighan.

Committee on buildings and grounds made report calling attention of board to repairs and fitting up needed in the buildings. On motion the committee were instructed to make the necessary repairs and such other things to make buildings comfortable.
On motion committee on supplies were instructed to purchase coal for winter use.

On motion D. F. Scammon was elected janitor of high school building at salary of \$25 per month.
On motion John Foster was elected janitor of first primary (Kindergarten) school at — per month.
On motion it was decided to commence the next term of school on September 7th, with a term of fifteen weeks to the 15th of December, then two weeks vacation, then commence first Monday in January with term of twelve weeks, vacation of one week and a closing term of nine weeks.
