



PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebrassa, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebrassa, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 4, A. D. 1902;

A joint resolution proposing to amend section one of article fifteen of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relative to the man ner of submitting and adopting amend-ments to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska.

Be it Resolved and Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska: ALL KINDS OF EDGE

of the State of Nebraska;

Section 1. That section one of article fifteen of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Either branch of the legislature may propose amendments to this Constitution and if the same be agreed to by three fifths of the members elected to each house, such proposed amendments shall be entered on the journals, with the yeas and nays, and published at least once each week in at least one newspaper is published, for thirty days immediately preceding the next election of senators and representatives at which election the same shall be submitted to the electors for approval or rejection, and if a majority of the electors voting at such election on such proposed amendment shall vote to adopt such amendment, the same shall become a part of this Constitution. When more than one amendment is submitted at the same election, they shall be so submitted as to enstel the electors to vote on each amendment separately.
