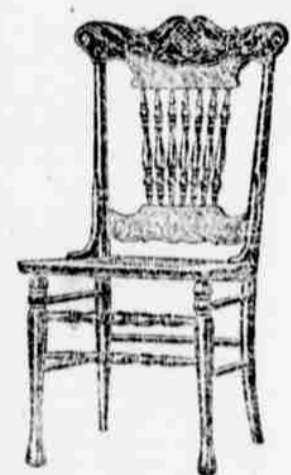

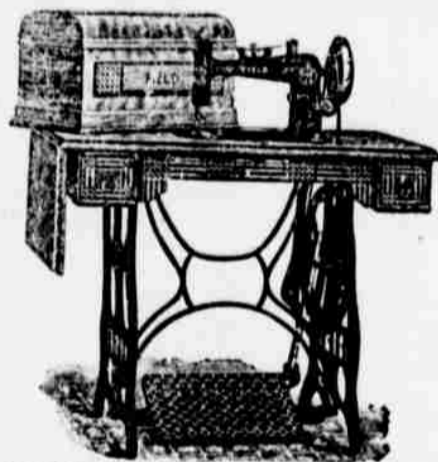

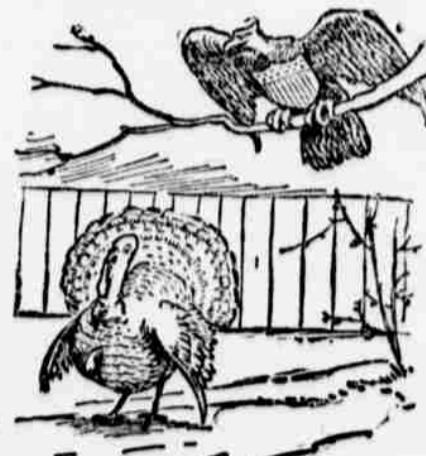

There much complaint that we have not teachers enough to handle our schools.

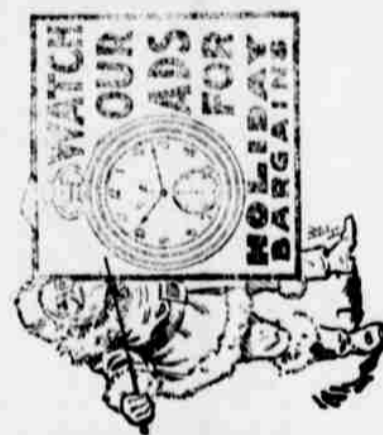
The meetings are still in progress at the Christian church. They now have an evangelistic singer assisting in the services.
