

The design of the monument is a very handsome one. The entire structure will be 14 feet high, consisting of the figure of a soldier at parade rest, 6 feet 2 inches high, surmounting a die 2 feet 9 inches square and 4 feet 6 inches high; the first base is \$ feet 6 inches square and 1 foot 6 inches high, the second base 4 feet 6 inches square and 1 foot 4 inches high, all resting on a foundation 6 feet 6 inches square, and 6 inches high. The monument is to be of a very light grey Bedford stone.




