TRADE REVIEW FOR THE WEEK.

September Opens With Fall Buying Apparently at a Maximum.

New York, Sept. 2.—Bradstreet's says:

September opens with fall buying apparently at a maximum, marked activity in all lines of industry. Liberal buying by railroads of rails and supplies, currency shipments to the country to move crops increasing and with confidence as to the outlook for trade previously noted strengthened by the successful issue of the Russo-Japanese peace negotiations. These latter, jointly with the increased pressure of supplies of agricultural products at leading markets, have had a distinct effect upon many commodity values, the tendency being toward a lower level in cotton, live animals, potatoes and butter. It is to be noted, however, that home products are strong and higher on the week. Something like a transference of fall trade activity from the west to the east is indicated in the reports that house trade is less active relatively in the former section, owing to the return home of excursionists, whereas the eastern markets have been benefited by an influx of out-of-town buyers. Western houses are, however, pushed to fill orders previously received and business west and northwest is still heavily in excess of a year ago. Large eastern centers report marked activity in all lines of cotton goods and larger buying of cotton, shoes, millinery, lumber, building materials and hardware. Wool has shown sustained strength on good demand for manufacturers. Leather and all its products display great strength. The central feature of the iron and steel trade at present is the continued liberal buying of rails by leading roads, the active demand for plates for ships and liberal placing of specifications for steel shapes for structural work.

Failures for the week number 161. Wheat, including flour, exports for the week ending Aug. 31 are 1,239,250 bushels, against 1,170,340 last week. From July 1 to date the exports are 8,906,754 bushels, against 16,464,992 last year.

Corn exports for the week are 1,163,270 bushels, against 987,294 last week and 710,562 a year ago. From July 1 to date the exports of corn are 9,227,817 bushels, against 5,273,001 in 1904.

WRITING POOR LIFE RISKS.

New York Insurance Investigation Unearths New Scandal.

New York, Sept. 2.—Evidence of extensive fraud in the writing of life insurance on risks known to be bad has been brought to the attention of the Armstrong legislative committee. It is asserted that in this class of fraud there has been collusion between the officers and agents of companies of high standing. Subpoenas summoning the medical examiners of some of the big companies to appear before the committee have been prepared. They will also be requested to have ready for the committee the medical records of the company for the last few years to be used as exhibits in case they are required. All the medical examiners probably will be called for the same day.

PRINTERS' STRIKE MAY SPREAD.

Question of Calling Out Men in Other Cities Under Consideration.

Chicago, Sept. 2.—Spread of the job printers' strike to other cities is a possibility following the arrival of James Lynch of the International Typographical union. In a conference here, President Lynch will talk over the situation as it applies to Chicago and the whole country with President Wright, J. C. Harding and other Chicago leaders. After the conference an order may be issued calling out printers in several large cities where the national Typothetae has shops. This action is counselled by some in order to weaken the strength of the Chicago Typothetae.

Emperor of Korea Disappears.

Victoria, B. C., Sept. 4.—The emperor of Korea has mysteriously disappeared, according to advices received by the steamer Athenian. The Yomuri, a prominent Tokio newspaper, said on Aug. 18 that the whereabouts of the emperor of Korea were then unknown. He had, the paper stated, disappeared since Aug. 1, and no one was cognizant of his present hiding place. Mr. Hayashi, Japanese minister to Korea, had examined several Korean officials to no avail and Consul Matsu is at Chemulpo seeking the whereabouts of the emperor.

Aeronaut Blown to Atoms.

Greenville, O., Sept. 1.—Aeronaut Baldwin of Louisville was blown to shreds with his balloon at a height of 2,000 feet. He was giving an exhibition of the use of dynamite from a balloon for war purposes and had three sticks of the explosive with him. When he was 2,000 feet in the air, in full sight of thousands of people attending the county fair, by some accident the dynamite exploded and the balloon and man were literally torn to fragments. Baldwin's wife was a witness of the horrible scene.

Seven Thousand Houses Burned.

Constantinople, Sept. 4.—Fire at Adrianople caused enormous damage. Seven thousand houses were destroyed in the Greek, Armenian, Bulgarian and Jewish quarters. There were many victims. With the exception of the Catholic church, the mosques, the schools, a convent and a telegraph office, few buildings were insured.
