Kansas City, Sept. 5.—Receipts of cattle thus far this week are 45,700; last week, 36,200; last year, 25,100. Monday's supply of cornfed beef steers was small and the market was steady to strong for them. Grassers, however, came in liberally and went at steady to 10c lower rates. Cows were steady to 10c lower, stockers and feeders weak to 10c lower. Veals steady. Choice cornfed steers were again scarce today and prices for them were

steady. Medium to fair kinds were steady to 10c lower. Grassers were mostly 10c lower, cows generally 10c lower, bulls steady to 10c lower, veals scarce and steady, stockers and feeders steady to 20c lower.


