### Big Meetings to Be Held Next Sunday at Opera House.

In the afternoon at 3 o'clock there will be a meeting for men only, and in the evening there will be a big union meeting of all the churches. The addresses of Mr. Simonds will be illustrated with stereopticon views showing the buildings and work of the Y. M. C. A. in this state, and will be very interesting. The Y. M. C. A. has accomplished wonderful work in the lines of religions, educational and physical training of young men and covers a field occupied by no other organization. The meetings should be attended by everyone interested in the moral welfare of the community.

### Cooper Recovers Damages.

The suit for damages of A. A. Cooper vs. the Farmers' Creek Telephone Company came up for hearing before Judge Reed last Tuesday and the testimony and arguments were not completed until Wednesday afternoon. Judge Reed handed down a decision in favor of the plaintiff Thursday morning. The damage suit grew out of an injunction suit instituted by the telephone company against Cooper early last summer. It seems that Cooper brought from J. B. Wisecarver his interest in the Farmers' Creek Telephone Company, and a disagreement arose between him and the company over the payment of dues. The company sought to enjoin Cooper from using the telephone line on the ground that he had no title to the phone. Judge Adams decided in favor of Cooper, who then brought suit to recover damages from the company. Cooper claimed \$24 personal damages and \$75 which he paid for attorney fees. Against this claim the company set up a counter claim of \$21.05 for dues, etc. Judge Reed allowed Cooper \$60 for attorney fees and \$21 personal damages, the latter being offset by the company's claim of \$21.
