OPEN SEASON. Prairie chicken and grouse, September 15 to November 30.

Quail, November 15 to 30.

Ducks, geese, jack-snipes, etc., Septemder 15 to April 10.

Trout, April 1 to September 30. All other fish, April 1 to November

To hunt without license except in the county of actual residence. To ship game or fish from one point
