**City Council Proceedings.**

Red Cloud, May 18, 1908.  
At a regular meeting of the city council in the office of the city clerk, Mayor Caldwell presiding, Councilmen Amack, Pulsipher and McArthur present the following business was transacted:

Bond of Frank Peterson as plumber was read. Motion made by Pulsipher and seconded by McArthur that the bond of Frank Peterson as plumber be approved. Ayes: Amack, Pulsipher and McArthur.

Petition of J. W. Kinsel from the business men asking the council to appoint Mr. Kinsel as night marshal. Whereupon the mayor appointed J. W. Kinsel as night marshal. Motion made by Pulsipher and seconded by Amack that the appointment be confirmed. Ayes: Amack, Pulsipher and McArthur. Carried.

Motion made by McArthur and seconded by Pulsipher that the salary of J. W. Kinsel as night watch be allowed \$15 as salary. Motion made by Pulsipher and seconded by Amack that the motion be amended to read "salary of \$25 per month." Ayes: Amack and Pulsipher; nays: McArthur. Carried.

Vote on original motion as amended. Ayes: Amack and Pulsipher; nays: McArthur.

The mayor appointed Frank Clawson as street commissioner. Motion made by Pulsipher and seconded by Amack that the appointment be confirmed. Ayes: Amack and Pulsipher; nays: McArthur. Carried. Motion made by Pulsipher and seconded by Amack that the salary of street commissioner be \$3 per day for the actual time employed on the street. Ayes: Amack, Pulsipher and McArthur. Carried.

Motion to adjourn to meet tomorrow at 9 a. m. in the office of the mayor. Carried.

May 19, 1908.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the city council in the office of Mayor Caldwell, the mayor presiding; Councilmen Amack, McCall and McArthur present, the following business was transacted:
