Trio of New York Thugs Fail to Make \$43,000 Haul.

In one of the most audacious at-
tempts of New York city, three thugs
made a daring attempt to hold up and
rob a trio of bank messengers as they
were carrying \$43,000 in cash from one
of the bank's branches to its main
building. Black pepper was showered
on the messengers, one of them was
hit with a blackjack and another
slashed with a knife in the desperate
effort of their assailants to seize the
money and escape with it before the
arrival of assistance. That they
failed to get clear with the valises
filled with coin and bills which the
bank employees were carrying was due
to the stubbornness with which the
messengers resisted the attack and to
the bravery of a young Polish waitress
in a nearby restaurant, who so im-
pudgely delayed the leader of the at-
tacking trio that he fell an easy victim
to two policemen who came running
to the rescue. He gave his name as
Casimiro Riechena.

Letter Carriers' Convention.

Lincoln, May 26.—Saturday the State
Association of Letter Carriers will
meet in annual convention in Lincoln.
Not only will there be a large number
of letter carriers in attendance, but
the postmasters presiding over letter
carrier offices will also be here in
force.

Bryan Returns to Lincoln.

Lincoln, May 26.—W. J. Bryan, it
was announced, will remain at Fair-
view for a considerable time. After
his tour of northern Nebraska, which
begins May 29 and ends June 4, he will
remain at his farm, filling a few speak-
ing dates in towns adjacent to Lin-
coln.

Ask Ruling of Washington.

Lincoln, May 22.—Owing to a num-
ber of complaints recently filed against
the refusal of railroads to fill inter-
state shipments for less than 100
pounds, the Nebraska railway com-
mission will ask the interstate com-
merce commission for a ruling in the
matter.

Time to File Briefs Allowed in Rail- road Controversy.

Lincoln, May 27.—The grain rates
hearing before the state railway com-
mission on complaint of Senator C. A.
Snyder against the Burlington road
closed at noon. The commission al-
lowed J. G. Becker, attorney for the
complainant, forty days in which to
file briefs, the defendant to have thirty
days to answer and the complainant
fifteen days additional for filing reply
briefs.

Divorces Due to Bad Cooking.

Lincoln, May 23.—Dr. W. H. Wil-
son, chief of the government bureau of
chemistry at Washington, in an ad-
dress to the students of the University
of Nebraska, said that 75 per cent of
the divorces was due to bad cooking.
His address was a plea for the observ-
ance of the pure food laws of the
country.

Ell Barnes Next Commander.

Hastings, Neb., May 25.—Ell Barnes
of Grand Island was selected depart-
ment commander of the Grand Army
of the Republic. The next depart-
ment will be in York.

Schavland Secretary of State Board.

Lincoln, May 22.—Chris Schavland
of Madison was elected secretary of
the state board of equalization. Schav-
land has been county clerk and county
treasurer of Madison county.

Two Watercresses.

It is a very curious fact that a good
many people do not know that two
battles were fought at Waterloo. Both
of these were fought against the
French, the first under the command
of the Duke of Marlborough on Aug.
17, 1759, who on this date actually oc-
cupied the same ground as the Duke of
Wellington did a little more than a
century later, June 17, 1815, the only
difference being that the former was
marching on Brussels and the latter
was marching from Brussels. In the
first battle the French were defeated
Brussels. They marched out to meet
Marlborough, but owing to the shock-
ness on the part of Schillingenburg, the
Dutch general, who was fighting with
him, it was not a success. Marlborough
only taking a few of the French troops
as prisoners. The following one,
fought against Napoleon by Wellin-
ton, proved to be one of the greatest
victories ever recorded in the annals
of England.
