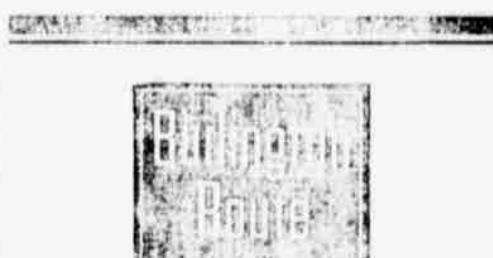
RIVER HIGHEST IN 17 YEARS

Missouri River Reaches Stage of 19.2 Feet at Omaha.

Omaha, June 21.—An unofficial measurement of the Missouri river showed a stage of 19.2 feet, and the highest the stream has been in twenty-seven years. The stream began running into Lake Koshkonong, but quick action in shutting up the lake prevented any serious results. There was much anxiety among 500 campers along the shores of the lake, who have been preparing to make their departure in the event of the river rising much more. Another foot rise would result in an inundation of all the lowlands north of the city.

Warren Inspects Fort Omaha

Omaha, June 21.—With a view to securing knowledge of required improvements, Senator Warren of Wyoming, a member of the military affairs committee of the senate, was escorted over Fort Omaha. The visit included an inspection of all buildings and the work that is being done at the fort.
