Great Fruit, Flower and Vegetable Show At Council Bluffs, Iowa.

That the farmer has time for the beautiful in life is evidenced in the fact that Council Bluffs, Iowa is to have national horticulture show of surpassing beauty and undreamed of variety. Flowers, vines, fruit and small garden truck from many states will compete with the "Iowa Grown" products. Idaho and California and other states both east and west are going to have state exhibits. There will be everything from great big chrysanthemums of many colors to wee, wee potatoes.

The show will be a revelation to those who think farmers slow and unprogressive. The farmer has improved his home surroundings with luxuries during the past few years. As certainly as the auto-van has taken the place of the farmer's horse in the city, so surely did the farmers rise to the occasion and gather in the luxuries of the city. Floriculture on the farm and the farm garden have been nurtured under adverse circumstances but to day they are successful competitors of the city exhibits. This is easily proven by a visit to Council Bluffs in mid December.

The National Horticulture Congress will be held at Council Bluffs, Iowa, December 14th to 19th. The fact that the Horticulture Show is held at the same time at the National Corn Exposition at Omaha, December 9th to 19 is worthy of note. The proximity of Council Bluffs and Omaha makes it possible for visitors at either the National Corn Exposition or the National Horticulture Congress to attend the other. The cities of Omaha and Council Bluffs are very close. It is only a matter of four miles from the center of Omaha to the center of Council Bluffs. A ten minute run by trolley makes good accommodations. The programs of the two shows having been so arranged that the visitors may participate in both events without any inconvenience.

Some of the attractions offered by the National Horticulture Congress will be of inestimable value to fruit and vegetable growers. There will be helpful lectures upon all phases of fruit growing. There will be demonstrations along the line of spraying, judging, and the working of modern horticulture equipment. Every known practice in successful fruit and vegetable raising will be touched upon. Many prominent horticulture speakers are on the program. Several carloads of western fruit have been on ice during the past two months to show the keeping qualities of the leading kinds of fruits under cold storage conditions.

Premiums to the amount of \$200 in cash, horticulture implement and supplies will be given. A premium list showing how this money will be awarded may be obtained by writing J. P. Hess, the president of the National Horticulture Congress at Council Bluffs, Iowa. Every one interested in fruit and vegetable should select an exhibit and enter it in a petition for the prizes. This will be the largest fruit and vegetable show ever held east of the Missouri River. A new auditorium of mammoth size is the permanent home of this Congress.

Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition.

Seattle, Nov. 19 From the present indications it is practically certain that the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition to be held in Seattle from June to October 15th of next year, will have the distinction of being the first world's fair to be completed in every detail by the opening date.

According to official figures just given out the construction of the building and grounds is now seventy-five per cent complete. Three of the permanent buildings, to become the property of the University of Washington at the close of the fair, the auditorium, fine arts and machinery hall, are entirely complete.

The plans for the federal buildings have been approved and contracts for the construction will be awarded within the next thirty days, with a time limit for completion set for March 1st of next year.

The grounds are in excellent shape even at this early date. A large section of the green lawn has already been laid out and a number of the winding paths have been completed.

There are more than a million plants now in the green houses ready for transplanting and the mild climate of Puget Sound makes it possible to set out the more hardy of these during the winter months.
