Of course the defeat of the income tax proposition is a serious disappointment to its Democratic advocates. Nevertheless even they obtain some measure of victory in the triumph of President Taft, for it has been agreed that both houses of Congress will pass, by the necessary two-thirds vote, a joint resolution providing for an amendment of the constitution speedily authorizing Congress to impose a tax on incomes. That such an amendment is necessary is doubted by some of the ablest lawyers in the Senate, including Mr. Bailey of Texas. On the other hand President Taft and other jurists of a standing which entitles their opinions to respect believe that it would be decidedly unsafe for the federal government to enact an income tax and depend upon it for revenues because of the possibility that the Supreme Court might again pronounce such excise unconstitutional. The accomplishment of a two thirds vote in both houses of Congress for the proposed constitutional amendment is no small achievement. That accomplished it will remain only for the states themselves to approve it and when three-fourths of them have done so all possibility of judicial defeat for an income tax will have been removed.

The contract for the construction of the new drydock of Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, has been awarded to the San Francisco Bridge Company, the contract being \$1,760,000. Announcement to this effect was made this week by the Assistant Secretary of the Navy. The drydock is to be the largest one that has been yet built by the United States and it will be capable of holding the largest vessels in the navy. Its length will be 620 feet, and its width 140 feet.

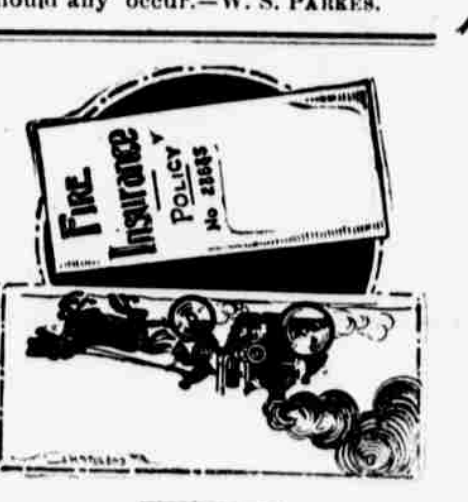
