COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

RED CLOUD, NEBR., Nov. 9th A. D. '09. Board met pursuant to adjournment. Members present, W. R. Anderson, T. J. Chaplin, G. W. Hummel, J. G. Overman and G. Ohmstede.

Petition asking for a division of Inavale Precinct in 2 road districts presented and read. The matter was laid over until next meeting.

Petition also presented to divide Batin Precinct in two road districts making a north and south district. Matter laid over till next meeting.

E. U. Overman appeared for Amboy bridge, petitioners, and asked for a hearing. Thursday 10 a. m. Nov. 11th, was set for hearing.

On motion it was decided to allow only \$3.00 for building to hold primary elections for year 1909. In accordance with this action claim of school dist. No. 26 was cut from \$5 to \$3 and \$5 was cut from \$5 to \$3.

In the matter of the road petition of John Sutton et. al. for the establishment of a public road commencing at the corner of section 19, township 1, range 12 and running thence west on the section line between sections 18 and 19 in said township and range, one mile, and terminating at the Franklin County line.

The same now being before the Board upon the petition, the report of the Commissioner. Notice, the claim for damages of \$350.00 filed and Henry A. Altman, the report of the appraisers and all the files and record. It was moved and seconded that the petition be granted the road established as above described Forty feet in width and order opened and worked, carried.

Thereupon on consideration of the said claim of Henry A. Aultman to wit: for land taken \$150 and for one mile of fence and maintenance \$209 total \$350. It was moved and seconded that the same be allowed at \$125 out of the general fund and the balance thereof rejected. Carried.

Nov. 11th, 1909 On motion bill of J. B. Carr be cut \$8 being that this referring to setting up booths at primary and general elections. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that County Surveyor, Geo. H. Overing be allowed \$20 per year for use of instruments, time of service beginning Jan. 1, 1908, and County Clerk is hereby authorized to draw warrants for same.

County Judge Edson appeared before Board and states that a number of valuable record books pertaining to his office are in constant danger of being destroyed by fire on account of insufficient safe room, and asks that he be furnished with a vault to store his records among the books he mentions are legacy record, inheritance record, Will record, index record, all probate and civil cases, Entry book A, record book A, Docket book I, and 13 other books.

As per appointment hearing of petition for bridge, between Secs. 3, 4, and 9, and 10-1-10 on road was had, E. U. Overman appearing for petitioners.

It was moved and seconded that petition for bridge at Amboy be rejected by unanimous vote. Motion carried.

Nov. 12th, 1909. It was moved and duly seconded Board advertise for bids for Superintendent of the Poor Farm for the year beginning March 1st, 1910, bids to be filed with County Clerk on or before December 7, at 12 o'clock in Board reserving the right to reject any or all bids. Motion carried.

Chairman appointed Ohmstede Chaplin and Overman Committee to contract for and build Vault for County Judge.
