George B. Throne.

George B. Throne was born in Cumberland County, Penn., in the year 1853. In the year 1872 he came west to Indiana. And on the 30, of October, 1880 he was united in marriage to Margaret Altman of Huntington, Indiana.

He accepted his Saviour Jesus Christ and was baptized on December 25, 1895 and has since made his home with The Church of the Brethren.

In the spring of 1897 he moved with his family to Red Cloud, Nebraska. To this union were born five children, Leota Smith, John, Edgar, Jessie and Paul Throne, who with their mother still survive him. The deceased passed from this life on earth on Saturday, January 22, 1910. Elder P. T. Grabbit of Silver Lake, preached the funeral. Again the cold hand of the last messenger to mortal man has been thrust into our midst; again death has taken hold of a fellow-citizen, a husband and a father. Mr. Throne was known as a good citizen, a provident father and prosperous farmer. In his death on last Saturday the entire community suffered a loss.
