BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayer and Council of the city of Red loud: Section i. That permission and anthority ishereby granted to Lloyd M. crabiil, his successors and assigns to continue the use of 24th. and to occupy for the term of Twenty years from April 1, 1910 the certain streets of the city of Red cloud herein described, for the
