In the matter of the estate of Jacob S. Reigle, Deceased.

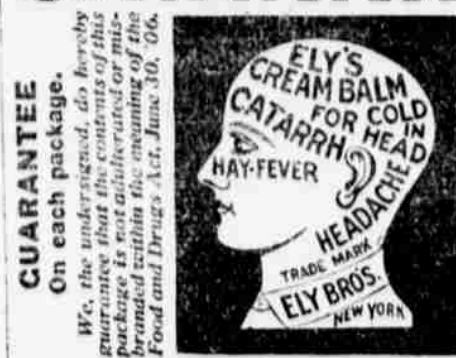

COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS.

Red Cloud, Sept. 19, 1910.
Board of County Commissioners of Webster County, Nebraska, met pursuant to adjournment. Members present: T. J. Chaplin, Louie Schmidt, G. W. Hammel and James G. Oyerman.

In the matter of the road petition of Edward Hansen et al. for the opening and establishing of a road, commencing at the corner of Sec. 1, Town 1, Range 11, and then running thence South one mile, and terminating at the south east corner of said Section 1, coming on for hearing at this time pursuant to the order made Aug. 12, 1910, upon said petition and the following claims for damages in connection therewith viz: Geo. W. Lindsey \$200, Henry Gilham \$50, C. R. Besse \$50, Augustus Roats \$2100, C. B. & Q. R. R. Co. \$103. The following action was taken. The petitions were represented by J. S. Gilham attorney. The claim of Augustus Roats present in person and by Bernard McNeny attorney the claimants Henry Gilham and C. R. Besse present in person. After hearing the statements of the parties. It was moved and carried that the members of the board, all go out and view the proposed road, and report, and that the board take further action on said matters on Sept. 20, '10 at 10 o'clock a. m.

On motion board adjourned to 9 o'clock a. m. Sept. 20.
Sept. 20th, '10 Board met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present. On motion the further consideration of the said road matter was laid over until Sept. 21st.

It was moved and carried that the County take and accept for highway purposes the strip of land adjacent to the present highway on se 4, 20-2-1 owned by J. R. Morse and described in the plat of the survey made by the County Surveyor Aug. 28, 1910 and pay to said J. R. Morse by warrant on the general fund \$10 for the same.

It was moved and carried that the clerk be and is hereby instructed to draw a warrant for \$10 on the general fund in favor of J. R. Morse in payment of said right-of-way above described.

2 p. m., Sept. 20th. It was moved and seconded that the board proceed to open the sealed bids for constructing bridges as filed by the following named companies: Nebraska Construction Co., of Lincoln, Nebr., Empire Bridge Co., of Falls City, Nebr., The Midland Bridge Co., of Kansas City, Mo., Western Bridge and Construction Co., of Omaha, Nebr., H. T. Ward & Co., of Tecumseh, Nebr., Standard Bridge Co., of Omaha, Nebr., The Canton Bridge Co., of Omaha, Nebr. (Motion carried.)

After a careful comparison of all bids as filed by the several companies, it was found that the bid filed by the Western Bridge and Construction Co., of Omaha was the lowest in price for material and construction of bridges, whereupon it was moved and seconded that the contract for the constructing of bridges for one year from the 20th day of Sept. 1910, be and is hereby awarded to the Western Bridge and Construction Co., of Omaha, Nebr., as per their bid on file. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the County Clerk be and is hereby instructed to purchase one copy of W. M. Leonard's Compilation of Statistics conveying land sales in 51 counties in Nebraska, from April 1st, 1909, to April 1st, 1910. (Motion carried.) On motion board adjourned to Sept. 21st.

Sept. 21st., 1910. Board met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present.

On motion the following claims against the Poor Farm Fund were allowed and the Clerk instructed to draw warrants in payment of same on said fund.

In the matter of the Road petition. Petitioning for a road on the section line on east side of Section 1, Twp. 1, Range 11, Webster County, Nebr. It was moved and seconded that petition for said road be granted. Motion lost.

Motion made and seconded that the matter of the above road be taken up for further action. Motion carried.

In the matter of the road petition asking that a road commencing at the North-East Corner of Section 1, Twp. 1, Range 11, Webster County, Nebr., thence running south 1 mile between Secs 1, Twp. 1, R. 11 and Sec. 6, Twp. 1, R. 10, and terminating at the South East corner of Section 1, Twp. 1, R. 11, be opened up and established.

It was moved and seconded that the above and foregoing petition be granted and said road be opened up and established as prayed for in said petition said road to be 40 ft. wide. Motion carried.

In the matter for the damages for the land taken, and used for said road, it was moved and seconded that Augustus Roats be allowed eighty

seven and 50-100 dollars per acre for a strip of land 20 feet wide across the east side and along the section line of the north east quarter of section 1, Twp. 1, R. 11 for the use of said road according to the appraisal. Motion carried.

In the matter of the damage for the land taken and used for said road.

It was moved and seconded that G. W. Lindsey be allowed eight-seven and 50-100 dollars per acre for a strip of land 20 ft. wide across the east side and along the section line of the south-east quarter of section 1, Township 1 range 11. In the matter of the claims filed for damages by Henry Gilham and C. R. Besse, they each of them appeared before the board and withdrew their claims and waived any and all claims for damages that may arise by virtue of the opening of the road.

Motion made and seconded that all other claims for damages be and are hereby rejected. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that the county surveyor survey and lay out said road as described in the petition and make a plat thereof and file same with the county clerk. Motion carried. On motion board adjourned to Sept. 22 1910.

In the matter of the road petition of E. Fitz, Patrick Kellett and others asking that a road commencing at the south-east corner of section 16, township 2, range 11, Webster county thence running north, between sections 15 and 16 in said township one mile to the northeast corner of said section 16 be opened up and established as a public highway, and also ask that the road now being traveled and commencing at the northeast corner of said section and running in a southeasterly direction across and through the west quarter and southwest quarter of section 15, in said township and county be vacated.

Moved and seconded that the above described road be and hereby is opened up and established as a public highway as surveyed and platted by Geo. H. Overing, county surveyor, and recorded in road record "A" at page 369. Motion carried. Moved and seconded that the road running southeasterly as described in said petition across west 1/4 nw 1/4 and sw 1/4 section 15-2-11 be and is hereby vacated. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded that the following claims be and hereby allowed and the clerk instructed to draw warrants on their respective funds in payment of same. Motion carried.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 8th, A. D. 1910:

A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section one (1) of Article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. (Amendment constitution proposed.) That section one (1) of article seven (7) of the constitution of the state of Nebraska, the senate concurring, be so amended as to read as follows:

Section 1. (Who are electors.) Every male citizen of the United States, of the age of twenty-one years, who shall have been a resident of this state six months next preceding the election and of the county, precinct, or ward, for the term provided by law shall be an elector; provided, that persons of foreign birth who shall have declared their intention to become citizens conformably to the laws of the United States and are voting at the taking effect of this amendment, may continue to exercise the right of suffrage until such time as they may have resided in the United States five years, after which they shall take out full citizenship papers to be entitled to vote at any succeeding election.

Section 2. (Ballots.) That at the general election nineteen hundred and ten (1910) there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage. At such election, on the ballot of each elector voting for or against said proposed amendment, shall be written or printed the words: "For proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage," and "Against said proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage."

Section 3. (Adoption) If such amendment shall be approved by a majority of all electors voting at such election, said amendment shall constitute section one (1) of article seven (7) of the constitution of the State of Nebraska.

Approved April 1, 1909.

I, Geo. C. Junkin, Secretary of State, of the state of Nebraska do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska is a true and correct copy of the original enrolled and engrossed bill, as passed by the thirty-first session of the legislature of the State of Nebraska, as appears from said original bill on file in this office, and that said proposed amendment is submitted to the qualified voters of the state of Nebraska for their adoption or rejection at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, A. D. 1910.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the great seal of the State of Nebraska. Done at Lincoln, this 29th day of July, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ten, and of the Independence of the United States the One Hundred and Thirty-fifth, and of this State the Forty-fourth.
