#### Notice of Election.

Notice is hereby given to the electors of the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, that at the coming municipal election to be held on the first Tuesday in April, 1911, the following proposition will be voted upon, pursuant to the resolution of the mayor and council of said city as hereinafter appears:

Whereas, There is a deficiency of water in the city wells, and it is necessary to adopt some means for increasing the supply of water, and

Whereas, There are not enough mains in the city to supply all the inhabitants with water, and the amount of money required for such purposes can not be provided by the ordinary revenues of the city; therefore, be it

Resolved, That the following proposition be submitted to the voters of the city at the next election for city officers:

Shall the Mayor and City Council of Red Cloud, Nebraska, be authorized to issue the coupon bonds of said city, to be denominated "The Water Extension Bonds of the City of Red Cloud," in the amount of \$60,000 six thousand dollars, in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars each, payable to bearer, and to become due twenty years after date, but payable at any time after the expiration of ten years, at the option of said city, and bearing not to exceed 5 per cent interest, payable semi-annually, and to be dated the day of their issuance, interest and principal of said bonds to be payable at the discretion of the State of Nebraska in the City of New York, said bonds to be sold for not less than par value, and the proceeds thereof to be used by said city for the purpose of extending, enlarging and improving its system of water works by connecting the Mauder springs and as the needs of said city and its inhabitants may require; and

Shall the Mayor and City Council of said city annually levy the necessary tax upon all the taxable property within said city, in addition to all other taxes authorized by law, to pay the interest on said bonds as the same becomes due, and to provide a sinking fund for the payment of the principal of said bonds.

The clerk is instructed to print upon the regular ballots:

Vote for one  
Against water extension bonds and taxes

The city clerk is instructed to publish the above proposition and the notice of election in the Red Cloud Chief, a newspaper of general circulation in said city, at least twenty days before said election, and post notices thereof at each of the polling places in said city during the day of election.

### THE LEGISLATURE

The senate has passed another non-partisan judiciary act, introduced by Senators Lee and McGrew, the supreme court having declared unconstitutional the one passed two years ago. The features to which the court objected in the former measure have been eliminated in the present bill, and it is

believed that it will stand the test of the courts. The new bill also applies only to judicial officers, supreme, district and county, while the bill of two years ago applied to state and county superintendents as well. The vote on the measure was 22 to 8, eighteen democrats and four republicans voting for it and eight republicans against it. Undoubtedly the bill will meet the approval of the house members.

A bill requiring the union label on all state printing has been defeated. Had it passed there would have been but little printing done for the state out side of Lincoln or Omaha, and while the country offices as a rule secure but a small portion of it, yet there may come a time when officers are elected that will be disposed to recognize them.

The house has passed the Taylor bill regulating the Omaha stock yards, and to the surprise of every one there was but one vote against it. When the bill was first reported out from the committee it was recommended for indefinite postponement, but its friends put up such a fight in its favor that it finally went through without opposition. The senate had previously passed the Ollis bill with only three votes against it, so there will probably be a conference committee to get together on the two measures.

The Lincoln Bryan Club is making extensive arrangements for the celebration of Mr. Bryan's birthday with a dollar dinner at the auditorium on March 20th. Among the notables from out of the state who will be present are Hon. Champ Clark, speaker-to-be of the next national house of representatives, Senator John W. Kern of Indiana, Senator Robert L. Owen of Oklahoma, and Governor John Shafroth of Colorado. Nebraska men who have been assigned places on the program are as follows: C. M. Skiles, "Progressive Legislation in the Nebraska State Senate"; E. B. Quackenbush, "Progressive Legislation in the Nebraska House of Representatives"; G. M. Hitchcock, "Election of Senators by Popular Vote"; W. H. Thompson, "Mr. Bryan's Connection With Nebraska Politics"; John A. Maguire, "Mr. Bryan at Home"; A. C. Shallenberger, "Guaranteed Bank Deposits"; Richard L. Metcalfe, "Mr. Bryan Versus Special Interests." Mr. Bryan will be the last speaker on the program.

A full fledged filibuster prevailed in the house of representatives Friday from 10:29 in the morning until about 2:30 o'clock in the afternoon. The house had under consideration Mr. Evans anti treating bill. A number of its supporters were absent and its friends who were present endeavored to have the bill laid over until Monday. Opponents of the bill demanded that it be voted on immediately. Mr. Evans started in to make a few remarks so that the vote would be stayed off and held the floor for four hours. There were numerous roll calls on various parliamentary propositions, all of which helped put in the time. Finally a vote was taken and the bill was defeated, 33 for to 52 against. For a while it looked as though the filibuster might last for a day or so, and both its supporters and opponents were preparing for a seige.

#### Growing Crops in Western Nebraska.

The Nebraska Experiment Station has just issued Bulletin 118 with the above-named title. This bulletin may be had free of cost by residents of Nebraska upon application to the Agricultural Experiment Station, Lincoln, Nebraska.


