Notice is hereby given to the electors of the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, that at the coming municipal election to be held on the first Tuesday in April, 1911, the following proposition will be voted upon, pursuant to the resolution of the mayor and council of said city as herinafter appears.

Whereas. There is a deficiency of water in the city wells, and it is necessary to adopt some means for increasing the supply of water, and

Whereas, There are not enough mains in the city to supply all the inhabitants with water, and the autount of money required for such purposes can not be provided by the ordinary reactions of the city: there fore, be H

Resolved. That the following proposition be submitted to the voters of the city at the next election for city officers:

Shall the Mayor and City Council of Red Vloud, Nebraska, be authorized to issue the roupon bonds of said city, to be denom nated "The Water Extension flonds of the wity of Red Cloud." in the amount of, \$6,000 six thousand dollars, in denominations of Five Hundred Bollars each, payable to bearer, and to become due twenty years after date, but payable at any time after the expiration of ten years, at the option of said city, and bearing not to exceed 5 per cent interest, payable semi-annually, and to he dated the day of their issuance, interest and principal of said bonds to be payable at the fiscal agency of the State of Nebraska in the City of New York, said bonds to be sold for not less than par value, and the proceeds thereof to be used by said city for the purpose of extending, enlarging and improving its system of ,water works by conmessing the Maurer springs, and as the needs of said city and its inhabitants now require; and

Shall the Mayor and tity geometrical said city annually levy the necessary tax upon all the taxable property within said city. in addition to all other taxes authorized by faw, to pay the interest on said bonds as the same becomes due, and to provide a sinking tund for the payment of the principal of said bonds.

The city cierk is instructed to publish the above proposition and the notice of election in the Red Cloud Chief, a newspaper of general circulation in said city, at least twenty days before said election, and post notices thereof at each of the polling places in said city during the day of election
