The council met in regular adjourned session Wednesday evening Nov. 8, 1911. With Mayor Foe presiding, councilmen present, Fogel, Herberger, Hutchinson absent Strong.

The Bond of Wolfe and Whitaker for \$2000 was presented and approved.

It was moved and seconded that the Mayor be authorized to fix the culvert on the south side of O. R. Boyce's property on 1st avenue.
Claims to the amount of \$1500 was allowed.
It was moved and seconded that the city Treasurer be instructed to pay

all Agency account bills where there is a discount allowed when presented by the Water and Light commissioner. It was moved and seconded that the council adjourn.
