Baby Dies Ever Ten Seconds From Some Preventable Cause

KANSAS CITY, Mo . Nov. 6 .-Watch the light flash. Every flash a baby died from a preventable disease Have You Seen The Girl in the civilized world." This was the grim wording of a placard which attracted wide attention at the Childs' Welfare exhibit in this city today. The exhibit opened last Thursday and

has attracted thousands of visitors from other cities. Infant mortality was the question to which especial attention was given today.

A small red electric light globe in a case flashing every ten seconds bearing the placard causes bundreds of mothers to stop and look with startled expressions meanwhile drawing their children closer to them. Figures and photographs showing the inroads of preventable diseases among Kansas City children were shown. Of 19,866 children in the schools examined last year by the health board it was shown that 9.6.4 were recommended for treatment. The records also showed in that number 3.461 suffering from adcnolds, in many cases entirely unknown to the parents - Omaha Bee.
