Camp Fire Girls

About 18 months ago a movement similar to the Boy Scouts, was started for the girls. It started as the Boy Scouts started, with a camp fire. There are three orders, The Wood Gatherers, The Fire Makers and The Torch Bearers. When a girl joins, first she becomes a wood gatherer. She stands for these desires: "It is my desire to become a Camp Fire Girl, which is to seek beauty, give service, pursue knowledge, be trustworthy, hold on to health, glorify work, be happy. They are then privileged to wear the Wood Gatherers ring and the Camp Fire girls middy with the emblem embroidered in its left arm.

The general aim of the Camp Fire Girl organization is to show that the common things of daily life are the chief means of beauty, romance and adventure. To aid in the forming of habits, making for health and vigor, the out-of-door spirit and the out-of-door habit, to devise ways of measuring and creating standards of woman's work, to give the girls an opportunity to learn to "keep step," to help girls and women to serve the community, which is the larger home, as they have served the individual home.

Membership is open to girls of twelve years and over. The local Camp Fire has taken Sa Mahpiya, which is the Dakota for Red Cloud, for its name. The principle of the Camp Fire was applied during the camping, most of the meals being prepared and served by the girls. The out-of-door habit was especially emphasized in the tramping and swimming. When camp was broken all wished that it were possible to camp longer. All of the camp visitors spoke of how well the girls "kept step" both in their work and their play.—Com.—Ad.
