**Some Farmers Waste Money Buying Seed Corn**

Probably the best seed for next year's planting will be the home grown, carefully selected and tested seed. Thousands of dollars have been wasted by farmers in the state of Nebraska by buying seed from a distance. It may look better, may even take prizes at some of the shows, but when it is tested with carefully selected native seed does not always give the yield. The Lincoln Experiment Station in bulletin 126 reports tests of native grown seed and seed not native. It was found that on an average the native grown seed carefully selected yielded six bushels more per acre than carefully selected seed brought from a distance. In testing some prize samples secured from the National Corn Show it was found that carefully selected native seed yielded nine bushels per acre more than the prize corn. With these facts in mind it would seem that we should select home grown seed, even if it does not look so well. The stalks this year which have produced seed in spite of the dry weather should give high yielding strains.
