As a result, a new course has been added in the college of agriculture intended for the long suffering consumer. As the town and rural inhabitants are both producers and consumers, the study promises a widespread appeal. Among the problems taken up are the home and domestic distribution of produce, wholesale and retail marketing, so-called "free delivery," parcels post, competition, and cooperation.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION ON COURT HOUSE PROPOSITION. NOTICE is hereby given that on the 14th day of April 1914 a special election will be held in Webster County, Nebraska, for the purpose of submitting to the people of said County the proposition to levy a special annual tax of four mills on the dollar on all the taxable property in said county for the year 1914, which together with all other taxes for County purposes shall not exceed the sum of fifteen mills on the dollar and such levy in the year 1915 as may be necessary to raise the total amount in the COURT HOUSE FUND to the sum of \$60000.00 and no more, provided the 1915 court house fund levy shall in no instance exceed the sum of four mills nor the total tax for county purposes including special court house fund levy, exceed the sum of fifteen mills on the dollar. Said Court House Fund to be used for the erection of a new court house on the present court house grounds at Red Cloud, Nebraska. Said new court house to cost finished, furnished and ready for occupancy not to exceed the sum of \$80000.00. That the form of the ballot used at said special election for submitting said proposition will be as follows: ROLL OF COURT HOUSE PROPOSITION AND SPECIAL TAX. In favor of new court house and levy of four mills in 1914, total levy for county purposes including special court house levy not to exceed fifteen mills on the dollar and such levy in 1915 as may be necessary to raise the total amount in the Court House fund to the sum of \$80000.00 and no more, provided the 1915 court house levy shall in no instance exceed four mills nor the total tax for county purposes the sum of fifteen mills on the dollar. Spotting Boarders

One-third of all the cows in Nebraska are milked at a loss. If you suspect that some of yours are among this third, keep a record of the number of pounds of milk produced by each cow. Determine the amount of butter fat of each cow through the use of a Babcock tester, which may be purchased for \$5. Then you can spot the boarder, providing you know the cost of the cow's feed. Personal problems may be handled free through correspondence with the dairy department of the University Farm at Lincoln.
