All the work will be under the supervision of the state and the Federal government will have nothing to do with it. In the thickly settled districts the roads are already built, but where the settlement is spread out over a large territory this Federal aid will be a great blessing. The government desires to help but it does not intend to go into the road making bussiness in opposition to the states.


