Red Cloud, May 11, 1914.

Board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Members present, viz: Storey, Hoffman, McCall, Ohmstede and T. J. Chaplin, chairman, of Board.

On motion the general contract for the court house building read, approved and signed.

On motion the bond of the Rowles Co., the general contractor for the said court house build, was passed upon by the county attorney and approved by the board of commissioners.

On motion the plumbing and heating contract for the new court house building was read, approved and signed.

In the matter of C. F. Evans claim for \$234

It was moved and seconded that a warrant be drawn for \$199 in favor of said Evans and \$25 be paid said Evans when job of moving court house is completed, steps to be placed at East entrance, chimneys properly protected at bottom, and no allowance to be made for moving closet or patching chimneys, as board did not require him to place building on foundation. On motion board adjourned to May 12.

### Died

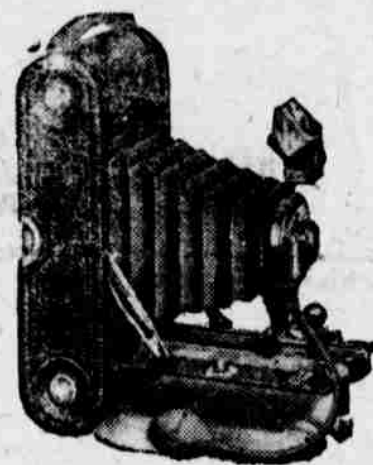
