**PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. THREE.**

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1914.

FOR a joint resolution proposing amendments to Section 1, of Article V, and Section 24, of Article V, of the Constitution of Nebraska, relating to term of office and salary of Governor and other executive officers.

Be it Resolved and Enacted by the People of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That at the general election for state officers to be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1914, the following be submitted as amendments to Sections 1 and 24, of Article V, of the Constitution of Nebraska:

Sec. 1. The executive department shall consist of a Governor, who shall hold his office for a term of two years from the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in January, next after his election, and until his successor is elected and qualified. In addition to the Governor, the executive department shall include the following officers: Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Attorney General, and Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings, each of whom shall hold his office for the term of two years from the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in January, next after his election, and until his successor is elected and qualified: Provided, however, that the first election of said officers shall be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1915, and each succeeding election shall be held at the same relative time in each year thereafter.

Sec. 2. That at said election on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1914, on the ballot of each elector voting thereat, there shall be printed or written the words: "For proposed amendments to the constitution, fixing the term of office and salary for governor, and other executive officers."
