### PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. THREE.

AMENDMENT NO. THREE.

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1914.

"FOR a joint resolution proposing amendments to Section 1, of Article V, and Section 24, of Article V, of the Constitution of Nebraska, relating to term of offices and salary of Governor and other executive others.

Be it Resolved and Enacted by the People of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That at the general election for state and legislative others, to be held on the Thesday succeeding the first Mon-

on the Thresday Succeeding the first Monday in November, 1914, the following be submitted as amondments to Sections 1 and 24, of Article V, of the Constitution of Nebriska:

Sec. 1. The executive department shall consist of a Governor, who shall hold his office for a term of two years from the first Thresday in January, next after his election, and until his successor is elected and weighted. In addition to the Governor, the following department shall include the following department shall include the following department for the first thresday of the first and the following department of Public Lands and Buildings, each of whom shall hold his office for the term of two years from the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in January, next after his election, and until his successor is elected and qualified. Provided, however, that the first election of said officers shall be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November. 1916, and each succeeding election shall be held at the same relative time in each even year thereafter. The Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, and Trensurer shall reside at the seat of government during their terms of office, and keep the public records, books and papers there, and shall perform such duties as may be caulred by law.

Sec. 24. The salary of the Governor shall be five thousand (\$5,000,00) dollars per anaum. The salaries of Auditor of Public accounts and Secretary of State. Superintendent of Public Lands and Buildings shall be two flows and five hundred (\$1,500,00) dollars each per annum, and of the Attracy General, four thousand dollars shall be five thousand (\$6,000,00) dollars each per annum, and the Lieuterat Governor shall receive one and one-half the compensation of a senator, and after the adoption of this constitution they shall not receive to their own use any fees, costs, interests upon public and salary for governor shall receive one and one-half the compensation shall be paid in allowing the first Monday in the first of the State
