

To make it, mix 20 parts dry bran to one part Paris green, add the juice and chopped pulp and peel of orange or lemon fruits to give perceptible flavor or odor and enough water to make a thoroly dampened mash A tablespoon full of the mixture may be placed near the bases of the plants. In the small garden it may often be easier to pick and de stroy worms or brush them in o a pan of oil and water than to poison them-Clean culture, of course, is important.
