Farmers in the country report that the chinch bugs and Hessian flies are making their appearance and are damaging the wheat somewhat. If the recent rain and cold weather have not exterminated these pests already prompt measures should be adopted to save the wheat. The stand is one hundred per cent fine and no stone should be left unturned to keep it in that condition until harvest.

Several cities in the state are offering the boys and girls money for gathering and exterminating dandelions. Prizes are offered also for those who collect the largest number of the pests each week and the warfare goes merrily on. Perhaps it would be a good thing if this city would do something of the sort and save the backs of the older people. If we really want to be rid of this flower this is a good method of accomplishing the purpose.

Chautauqua time will soon be here. If the people of this city desire to carry out some of the plans suggested in the past, plans should be formulated at once. If they do not intend to enter the ring it might be well to let the various associations know the situation and let them come in and put up programs as they see fit. The Chief would like to see a chautauqua given practically free one year at least. Conducted with the farmers' institute it would be a success.

If every vacant lot in town were planted to corn or tomatoes it would add considerably to the revenue of this community and would also add to the appearance of this city as a whole. The slogan this year is "plant something." The people of Europe have no time to plant and they must have provisions from other countries. We believe that one of the best things that this city could do would be to have every lot used thruout the growing season and we believe that there are enough industrious boys here to do the business. Prizes could be offered for the best, second best, sixth and thirteenth so as to make the work competitive as well as remunerative. This would put ginger into the campaign and have a wholesome effect on the boys. At the same time it would give the grown people a lively interest and the entire city would eagerly watch the outcome. Mr. Boehr of the agricultural department of the high school has signified his willingness to help any boy who wanted help and he will give his services without money and without price. Here is a practical thing and a definite thing for our business men. It should be disposed of at once.

Notice To Parents

Note that there is an important change in the free high school attendance law.

The state superintendent in a circular dated May 1 has the following to say in regard to the changes in the law, viz:

"Relative to the free attendance law, the fee was changed from 75 cents to \$1.00 per week. It will be observed that it is necessary for the county superintendent to have in his hands before the first of June the list of eighth grade graduates entitled to free tuition under the law in order that the school boards may be authorized by the second Monday of June to make provision for the required tuition."

Note that non-resident students must make application each year.

The town superintendents or principals at Bladen, Blue Hill, Rosemont, Cowles, Guide Rock, Red Cloud, Inavale have supplied all non resident students in their high schools with application blanks for free high school tuition. Each eighth grade graduate in this year's class has been supplied with an application blank. If you desire free school tuition be sure to fill out the blank and send it in to the county superintendent's office as directed in the extract from the state superintendent's circular quoted above.

Remedy For Melon Aphid

The results of spraying experiments at the Nebraska Agricultural Experiment Station show that tobacco washes are the safest and most effective applications for the little green or black plant lice or aphids destructive to melon and cucumber vines. If a tobacco extract is not readily obtainable, a good solution may be made by dissolving one and one half pounds of soap in one gallon of water, adding two quarts of strong tobacco decoction and diluting it to make five gallons. The tobacco decoction is made by steeping tobacco stems in water until the decoction becomes the color of strong coffee
