SEWER BOND PROPOSITION.

Notice is hereby given to the electors of the try of Red Cloud, Webster county, Nebraska, pursuant to a resolution adopted by the mayor and council of said city, at a regular adjourned meeting thereof July 7th, 1915, by which resolution the council determined upon a system of sewerage and the estimate of the cost thereof, that a special election is called and will be held in said city, at the usual voting places therein to-wit: In the first ward at the office of the city water and light superintendent and in the second ward at the Fireman's Hall on the 19th day of a. m. and 7 o'clock p. m. at which the following proposition is submitted to be voted upon: Shall the Mayor and City council of the

braska, in the amount of fifteen thousand dollars in denominations of five hundred dollars each, payable to bearer, to become due 20 years after the date thereof, but payable any time after the expiration of five years at the option of said city, and bearing not to exceed five per cent annual interest and to be dated the day of their issuance, interest and principal to be payable at the office of the state treasurer of Nebraska. Said bonds to be sold not less than par value with acerued interest and proceeds thereof to be used by said city for the construction and establishing a system of sewerage in and for said city, said system not to include any lateral or district sewer; and shall the mayor and council of said city annually levy the necessary tax upon all the taxable property etthin said city, in addition to all other axes, to pay the interest upon said bonds, as the same may become due and to furnish a sinking fund for the payment of the prinipal of said bonds, and an annual tax of not to exceed two mills on the dollar of assessed valuation of the property of said city for the purpose of maintaining and repairing said ystem of sewerage."

Should a majority of the ballots cast at such in election be in favor of said proposition the mayor and council of said city will be authorized to issue and negotiate said bonds according to the conditions and for the purpose specified in the foregoing proposition an l as also contemplated by the statutes of Nebraska as in such case provided and it shall be the duty of the mayor and eterk of said city when so authorized and by order of the city council to sign and attest said onds and affix thereto the scal of said city. The proceeds of said bonds shall be paid to the treasrer of said city of Red Cloud and kept by him in separate fund, apart from other moneys, to be known as a sewerage fund and paid out only by order of the council and warrant drawn against
