The U. S. Trust Co. Buy School Bonds

RED CLOUD, NEBR., Jan. 10, 1916. Board met pursuant to adjournment, at Commercial Club room, with all members present.

In the matter of the sale of the \$35,000.00 High School Bonds: Bids were submitted by the State Bank and J. W. Auld, also by Jas. T. Wachob (by W. A. Sherwood), also United States Trust Co., (by S. R. Florence).

Upon motion the Board proceeded to ballot on the bids, the same resulting in four votes in favor of the acceptance of the bid of the U. S. Trust Co.; delivery of the bonds to begin March 1, 1916, ending Sept. 1, 1916, in the amount of \$5000 principal or multiples thereof on the first of either March, April, May, June, July, August or September 1, 1916, as desired by the Board. The purchase price being the principal of bonds delivered and accrued interest thereon to time of delivery; and in addition a premium of \$50 payable on delivery of the last lot September 1, 1916.

Bid of the United States Trust Co., declared accepted, as above stated, and bonds sold on said terms.

Upon the recommendation of Superintendent Whitehead, Board appointed the city marshal as Truant Officer, he to receive a fee of 25 cents for each delinquent reported. Also at the suggestion of the Superintendent, an exchange of Civil Government text books was allowed.

Motion made and carried that solid Geometry and Trigonometry be dropped from the Agricultural course.
Board now adjourned.
