Early Oats Yield Most

Early oats yielded an average of 14 bushels more an acre than the late oats in a test of 20 varieties at the Agricultural Experiment Station at Lincoln. The early varieties which ripened July 11, on the average, yielded 53.9 bushels, while those that ripened July 20 produced about 40 bushels. Kherson, Burt, and Texas Red are among the early varieties that proved best. Among the late varieties, the Lincoln oats have given the best results.

About eight pecks an acre gives the best results when Kherson oats are drilled and about ten pecks an acre when they are sown broadcast. Varieties with larger grains require a correspondingly heavier rate of seeding.

Annual Report

The annual report of the Nebraska State Horticultural Society for 1915 is now of the press. This report contains three hundred pages of the latest information on fruit, flower, vegetable and tree growing in Nebraska. It is fully illustrated with twenty-seven full page engravings of fruit, flower and vegetable scenes on Nebraska farms. Every person interested in any phase of horticulture should have a copy.

Any contractor or contractors desiring to figure on the above named building and desiring a set of plans until date of letting shall deposit with the Architects a certified check for Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) as a guarantee that the contractor will not only return plans but submit a bona fide bid to the Board of Education on or before the date of letting, otherwise the deposit will be forfeited to the Architects.

Full instructions will be found in the specifications. The school board reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
