**W. H. Taber Treats Hogs At Lincoln Asylum**  
 Two head of hogs in the herd at the asylum for the insane at Lincoln died and it was feared cholera was the cause. Henry Gerdes of the state board of control, hog expert of the board, diagnosed the disease as "worms." He employed W. H. Taber of Inavale, to treat the hogs and his theory was confirmed. The hogs are now doing well. Commandant Walsh of the home for soldiers at Grand Island, reported sickness in the herd at that institution. Mr. Taber has been sent there to investigate. Early in the year, the state's hogs at the penitentiary were in bad shape on account of the same ailment, but none were lost. --Sunday State Journal.

**Cherry Olives**  
 Do not remove stems from cherries used for pickling. Wash the cherries and pack tightly into sterile jars. Pour the following mixture over one quart of cherries: 1 tablespoonful salt, 3/4 cup vinegar. Fill up the remaining space in the jar with cold water. Place on rubber and cover and seal. Jars with glass covers are best to use with vinegar, since they will not corrode.
