Public Library for Red Cloud

At an adjourned meeting of the City Council held in the Council Chambers last night, Mayor Robert Damrel called the meeting to order with the following members present: Koonz, Hamilton and Saladen. Atant, Stevens.

Attorney Howard S. Foe appeared and asked the Council to grant permission to enclose streets around Chautauqua grounds and the city furnish lights for them. The request was granted upon condition that the streets be cleaned thoroughly after the Chautauqua is over.

Mayor Damrel presented a letter from the Nebraska Public Library Committee giving information as to the establishment of a public library in this city and after the matter was thoroughly discussed it was unanimously agreed by the Council that an effort would be made to obtain a public library for Red Cloud. Mr. Folsom, of the firm of Grant & Fulton, of Lincoln, appeared and presented a proposed plan for sewerage as well as any amount of essentials from such cities as Alliance and Grand Island as regards his firm's ability. After due consideration the Council entered into a contract with the said firm to furnish plans and specifications necessary for the construction of a sewerage system for this city.

The Council then adjourned to Friday, July 21st at 8 p. m.
