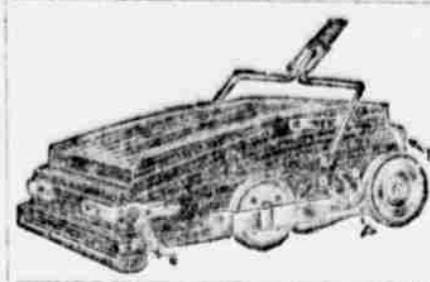

Fair is a Success

The Webster county fair held at Bladen last week was well attended and all those in attendance state that it was even better than the average county fair.

Wednesday was Farmer's Union Day and a large crowd was present to hear the Union speakers. In the afternoon Plainview and Invalde base ball teams crossed bats, resulting in the latter taking the honors.

On Friday, Keith Neville, democratic candidate for governor of this state, addressed the audience, making a very favorable impression. His address convinced his audience that he was all that a man should be and capable of assuming the duties of the governor's office, should he find we think he will be elected to this office at the coming fall election.

The Red Cloud Indians met the Guide Rock team on the diamond in the afternoon, furnishing entertainment for all the "fans"; the result of the game being victory for the Indians by a score of 17 to 0.

Many from this city, who had made the trip, via auto, experienced some difficulty on the return trip, owing to the fairly heavy fall of rain, late in the afternoon.

The exhibits this year were unusually large and varied, with the exception of the agricultural exhibits, which were not up to standard, owing to the fair being held so early in the season, and the lack of moisture during June and July.

There was an abundance of good band music, furnished by the Bladen and Plainview bands; good free act tractions, horse races and a motor cycle race, also fireworks at night. To sum up the entire program, it was a good fair and well worth the money. Let the good work continue during the coming year, 1917.
