## Nebraska Issue Tries To Damage Neville's Character

A four-page edition, labeled "The Nebraska Issue," issued by the Anti-Saloon League of Nebraska, edited by one H. P. Carson, reached our desk last week and we note that a quarter page or more of the sheet is devoted to "throwing mud" at Keith Neville, the democratic candidate for governor of the state of Nebraska. This space is given over to a picture, labeled in large black type, "Keith Neville's Saloon Building at North Platte." It is also charged that Neville rents rooms over the saloon for immoral purposes.

If Carson or any of his followers will take the trouble to look into the matter, they will find that Neville has never conduced a saloon, himself, and is an abstainer, also that saloons no longer exist in North Platte, and the building is now used for other purposes. Also it will be found that when the court investigated the rooming house case and examined several witnesses, that the charges were groundless, and decided in favor of the defendant.

Regarding the charges that Neville's campaign is being managed by a man, namely, Henry C. Richmond, who is also working for the interests of the Nebraska Prosperity League, the facts are that the newspaper advertising work of Neville's primary campaign was managed by Richmond, known to all Nebraska editors as an honorable and able newspaper man, but after the primaries his connection with Neville's campaign ceased entirely.

The substance of the whole matter is that Carson publishes these misleading insinuations for the purpose of prejudicing dry voters against Neville.

We cannot see where Carson is gaining any ground for his party, as it is our opinion that dry voters are too broadminded to take any stock in Carson's slurring remarks against Neville.

We also feel that Carson's tactics will do more to hinder the cause than help it, as there are many supporters of Neville who are also in favor of the amendment.

### Concrete Granary Floors

Concrete floors for granary and corn crib will not cause grain to become musty if the concrete is allowed to dry out for two or three months, according to investigations carried on by the agricultural engineering department of the College of Agriculture, Lincoln. Once the concrete becomes thoroughly dry it will not absorb moisture from the soil and transfer it to the grain. This conclusion was reached as a result of correspondence with 45 farmers who have had experience with concrete floors in buildings for storing grain.

According to U. S. Government statistics, Nebraska produced 213,000,000 bushels of corn in 1915, of which 20% was shipped out of the county where it was grown. This means that 42,600,000 bushels of Nebraska corn were sold for shipment in 1915.

Official reports for the year 1915 show that about two-thirds of the amount shipped, or 28,000,000 bushels, was soft corn. This soft corn was not available for elevator storage on account of too much moisture in the corn. A small portion of such corn can be dried, but the bulk of it was used for distilling purposes.

According to government statistics, the estimated farm value of corn for 1915 was 61 cents per bushel, an average which could not have been maintained had it not been for the fact that the soft corn was bought by distilleries at practically FULL MARKET VALUE of grade corn, deducting only for difference in moisture.

Had there been no distilleries, there would have been next to no market at all for the soft corn of 1915. The soft corn would certainly have sold for about 20c a bushel LESS than grade corn, provided it could have been used at all.

This would have meant a loss to Nebraska corn growers in the year 1915 of the enormous sum of \$5,600,000!
