McCook then took possession M of the ball and went down the field T with line plunges, Cliff Hegenberger S going over for a touchdown and S then kicking goal. McCook kicked to C Red Cloud and this time the visitors returned the ball to the forty yard line and lost on downs. After two successful attempts to make gains thru Red Cloud by center rushes, Halfback Gatewood kicked a field goal from thirty yard line making the score 10 to 0.

In the second quarter, McCook wept the field in great offensive drives (war dope) tearing the Red's ine assunder and taking trench after trench of the white chalk lines till Gatewood plunged over their barricks for another touchdown. With Hegenberger kicking goal, McCook adranced her score to 17 to 0

McCook received the ball in the third quarter and returned for thirty yards losing on downs. Red Cloud punted out of bounds and McCook lost on a fumble. Red Cloud then played for heavy gains thru McCook's line and was successful in pushing the pig skin over for six points but failed to kick goal. During this part of the game, McCook's line seemed to weaken, especially the left side thru which most of the gains were made.
