President Urged to Bring Standard Up to Full \$700,000 Regulars-Relief Men in News Quarantine

Western Newspaper Union News Service. Washington .- Plans to forward further preparedness measures for the army have began to assume definite form. How an increased army force may be promptly secured for the present emergency, as well as universal training as a national policy, was discussed by President Wilson with Senator Chamberlain of Oregon, chairman of the senate military committee. At the same time Secretary Baker and administration leaders in congress considered legislation needed immediately for the military establishment.

Senator Chamberlain told the president he believed the executive now has authority without further action by congress to raise at once an army of more than 700,000 men by increasing the regular army to war strength and calling out all of the national guard, at war strength with co operation with state executives.

Mustering Out Is Suspended

Washington .- Nearly twenty thousand men have been added to the national guard force available for FTHE far-famed region of the Tyrol federal police duty by a war department order suspending the muster out of all guard organizations still in the federal service. With the men called out during the past few days, this gives the government upward of fifty thousand guardsmen for employment in their home states to protect industries and other property. Most of the men affected by the order are at their home mobilization camps preparing to return to civilian life after long stays on the Mexican border. They now will be held at their camps or armories for assignment as conditions require.

In all 22,000 men are retained by the order, but several of the units already had been designated for federal service.



Navy recruiting stations were the scenes of activity unprecedented since the Spanish-American war.

Ohio Governor Issues Proclamation Columbus, O .- Governor James M. Cox has issued a proclamation calling upon the citizens of Ohio to prepare for war.

"It is unnecessary to elaborate upon the turbulent conditions of the world. We are so closely related to them that any surrender to the free and easy idea that things will turn out all right would be plain incompetence," the proclamation reads.

Interned Americans at Brussels

London .- An exchange Telegraph dispatch of recent date from Amsterdam says:

"Frontier correspondents hear from Brussels that the American legation is completely isolated and under a guard of German police. It is rumored that the Germans contemplate taking the minister (Brand Whitlock) and his staff to Germany. The Americans in Brussels have been notified they cannot leave Belgium before three months at the earliest."

Miami, Fla., William J. Bryan has addressed an appeal to the senate and house of representatives urging that an attempt be made to secure the suspension of Germany's ruthless submarine campaign through the application of the so-called Bryan peace plan which provides for an investigation of all disputes by an international tribunal before resort to war. Mr. Bryan asked that congress also consult the wishes of the people through a refrendum if it concludes that nothing but war will satisfy the nation's honor.
