Kansas City Market

Kansas City Stock Yards, Aug. 6.-Cattle receipts dropped to 16000 head today, market strong to 25 higher on killing cattle, top price \$13.80, 25 to 50 higher on stockers and feeders. Hog receipts were 9000, market 10 to 15 higher, top \$18.30. Sheep and lambs today 36000, market strong, nothing choice, native lambs \$14.

Killing Cattle The severe break in prices last week, and rains of a more or less general

nature since the middle of last week, stopped loading for this week's market in large degree, hence the reduced supply, here and elsewhere. Native steers sold strong to 25 higher, numerous lots at \$13.25 to \$13.80, the top paid for long yearlings, highest price ever paid for baby beef here. Westerns sold 15 to 25 higher, receipts light, Kansas steers worth \$8.75 to \$12.25, Oklahomas \$7.50 to \$10.75, Old Mexico steers grazed in Oklahoma or Kansas \$6.50 to \$8.25. Butcher cattle got the full advance, some sales more than a quarter higher. Receipts included 9 cars of California steers, at \$8.35 to \$9.25, weights 875 to 1050 lbs.

Stockers and Feeders Prices touched bottom last week and around 25,000 cattle were sent to the country, 10000 more than during previous week, and twice as many as same week last year. Stock steers at \$6 to \$7.50, feeders \$7.25 to \$9.75 were current quotations last week, but these were revised upward 25 to 50 cents per cent, today on the strength of reported rains around, and light supplies.

Hogs Dry weather sent in a large amount of trash last week, and the spread in prices widened greatly. Best hogs sold 10 to 15 higher today, but there is a little improvement in common hogs. It is figured that the rains will stop the run of common hogs. Choice heavy weights are scarce, and the right kind would have gone above \$16.30 today, medium weights selling up to \$16.20, light hogs at \$14.75 to \$15.75. Every Western market is running behind this time a year ago in receipts, and the large number of immature hogs sent forward lately hurts prospects for future supplies some, though many of the pigs will be immunized at the plants around the stock yards, and resold as stock hogs.

Articles of Incorporation

We, the undersigned, incorporators, do hereby in pursuance of the Statutes of Nebraska, in such cases made and provided, associate ourselves together as a body politic and corporate in the manner and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

Article 1-That the corporation shall be named and known as Riverton-Inavalle Light and Power Company.

Article 2-That its principal place of business shall be the City of Red Cloud, Webster County, Nebraska.

Article 3-The general nature of the business which may be transacted by said corporation shall be as follows:

To acquire land and construct, maintain and operate an electric transmission line or lines over the public highway in said county or counties, to purchase electric current, and to sell said electric current to any person or corporation along the line of said transmission lines; to issue stock, bonds, or a mortgage or other legal evidences of indebtedness, and to do such other things as are necessary in the transaction of the business above defined.

Article 4-The amount of authorized capital stock of said corporation shall be Ten Thousand Dollars, (\$10,000.00). The amount of bonds said Company may issue shall not exceed Ten Thousand Dollars, (\$10,000.00).

Article 5-The existence of said corporation shall commence when said articles of incorporation are filed with the Secretary of State and County Clerk of said County, and are published according to law, and shall continue for forty (40) years unless sooner terminated by due process of law.

Article 6-The greatest amount of liability to which said corporation may at any one time be subject shall not exceed two-thirds of the capital stock of said Corporation.

Article 7-The capital stock of said Corporation shall be divided into 400 shares of Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) each. Article 8-The affairs of said corporation shall be conducted by the Board of five directors, who shall hold such positions for a period of one year from the completion of the said organization of said incorporation, and annually thereafter said Board of directors shall be elected by the stockholders from among their number as shall be approved by the by-laws of said corporation, hereafter to be adopted by said Board of Directors. The Board of directors shall choose a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and said Secretary and Treasurer may be the same person. Said directors shall perform all of the duties required in establishing and conducting the business affairs of said Corporation, and as provided by the by-laws of the corporation. Said officers shall each hold his official position for a period of one year unless removed by said Board of Directors or otherwise.

Article 9-The place of meeting of the said Board of Directors shall be at Red Cloud, Webster County, Nebraska, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors holding said offices from year to year. The said directors shall as soon as convenient after the formation of said incorporation elect said officers at a meeting to be held in Red Cloud, Nebraska, and provide for the opening of stock subscription books and for the transaction of the business affairs of said corporation, provide the necessary seal and record book, which shall be in the form to be determined by the said directors. Vacancies in the Board of directors during the first year of the corporate existence shall be filled by the then holding directors, and thereafter vacancies shall be filled by the said stockholders in the manner provided by law and the by-laws of this corporation.

Article 10-These articles of incorporation may be amended at any time. Every amendment thereto shall first be approved by a majority of the holding Board of Directors, and upon being approved it shall be entered at large upon the records of the Board, to be accurately kept by the Secretary. Each of such amendments shall be made a part of the articles of incorporation and shall be acknowledged as the record, and public and recorded in the same manner as these articles.
