Fifty More Men Were Examined Wednesday

Owing to the number of claims for exemption that were filed by those summoned in the first call and also due to the number found physically unfit for service it was necessary to call another one hundred men. On Wednesday fifty appeared before the local board for the physical examination and out of this number only nine were found that did not ask for exemptions. Another fifty men will be examined to day.

Among the number of claims filed it is found that one man asked to be excused on account of religious belief. While we have unmeasured respect for the man who professes a belief and actually lives up to the same we feel that when he uses this belief for the purpose of dodging the duty he owes to the flag which makes it possible for him to worship his Maker in the way he sees fit, that he is no better than many other good christian men who have answered the call.
