

The story of the accident as nearly as can be determined runs as follows: Richardson signaled the engineer to back up and book onto the train. As the engine passed him he attempted to swing himself up on the step but failed to make it, falling down and underneath the engine which passed over the lower part of his body. None of the crew were witnesses of the accident, which happened in the space of a few minutes. The first they knew of it was, after having annexed the waiting cars, they started down the track again, when the engineer then noticed a large drowd blocking the way. No time was lost in securing medical services for the injured man whose condition was manifestly serious.
