AMERICAN SPEECH WEEK

During the war we became used to drives of all sorts. We had drives for the Red Cross, the Liberty Loans, the Belgian Relief and War Savings Stamps-the more the merrier. The first week in November is to witness a big drive in full force throughout the Red Cloud school. Its object is neither to collect money, nor to gain members for an organization, but to arouse a keener interest in the language of the American flag. This is a better speech drive and we want all, from the highest to the lowest to aid the English department in its work. The war is over, but patriotism still requires that we show our loyalty to American ideals by protecting and im proving our national speech.

The first observance of this kind was held in Brooklyn, New York, in the spring of 1915. Since then, the movement has grown in strength and importance until last year nearly all the larger schools of the country held a Speech Week at some time during the nine months' session. In the cities, the work has been taken up by organizations outside of the schools and brought into direct relation with the lives of the people as a whole. The Speech Week held in Chicago last year was under the supervision of the Chicago's Woman's Club, and came very near to touching all phases of the city's life. It was through the influence of the women of this club that Marshall Field's store held an enthusiastic observan c. Now comes a call from the National Council of the teachers of English for a nation wide effort in this dice :tion. Every school in the county is asked to set sside the first week in November as American Speech Week.

The idealism of the war served to arouse in many ways the upward strivings of our national life. To capitalize such strivings and shape them to a definite end is clearly the chief duty of education at the present time. The speech movement is one of the major opportunities of doing this. The amount of illiteracy and ineffective and slovenly speech disclosed by the army tests has awakened the whole country to our language deficiencies. We all realize that there are thousands in our midst who remain untouched by the American spirit because they cannot communicate with us. There are thousands more who cannot play their full part as citizens and workers in our industrial democracy, because they cannot use our language effectively. The country is getting ready to do something about the question of our speech. It is high time to develop a strong public sentiment for a common tongue that is at once clear, pleasant and forceful .--Red Cloud High School Mirror.
