On motion of Waldo, seconded by Hubatka, the following resolution



On Tuesday evening the city council held a special meeting with the mayor and all members, for the purpose of taking action in view of the casuality at the power house. After a general discussion of the matter the council

purchased a .200 horse power Semi-Diesel oil engine, which will be connected to one of the generators, the purchase price being \$14,181.00. The same was purchased from the Fairbanks-Morse Company and shipment will be made in about thirty days. For some time past considerable complaints have been made regarding the poor service owing to the overload which the power plant was compelled to stand With this new power unit added to the plant the users of "juice" will be assured of a first class service The council also passed ordinance 61 which appears on another page of this


