PURE BRED HOGS BRING VERY FANCY PRICES

Clarence Johnston's second annual
pure bred Duroc hog sale was held
in Red Cloud's new \$80,000 Besse
sale pavilion, on Friday afternoon,
attracting a large number of out
of town buyers, as well as a goodly
representation from all over the county.
In fact the local support was exceed-
ingly good, only three sows being
purchased by breeders outside the
county. Last year Mr. Johnston's
hogs made an average of \$107, this
year beating this figure by \$53 or
an average of \$160, the total re-
ceipts of the sale was \$7163.00, and
once again clearly displays that the
pure bred line pays.

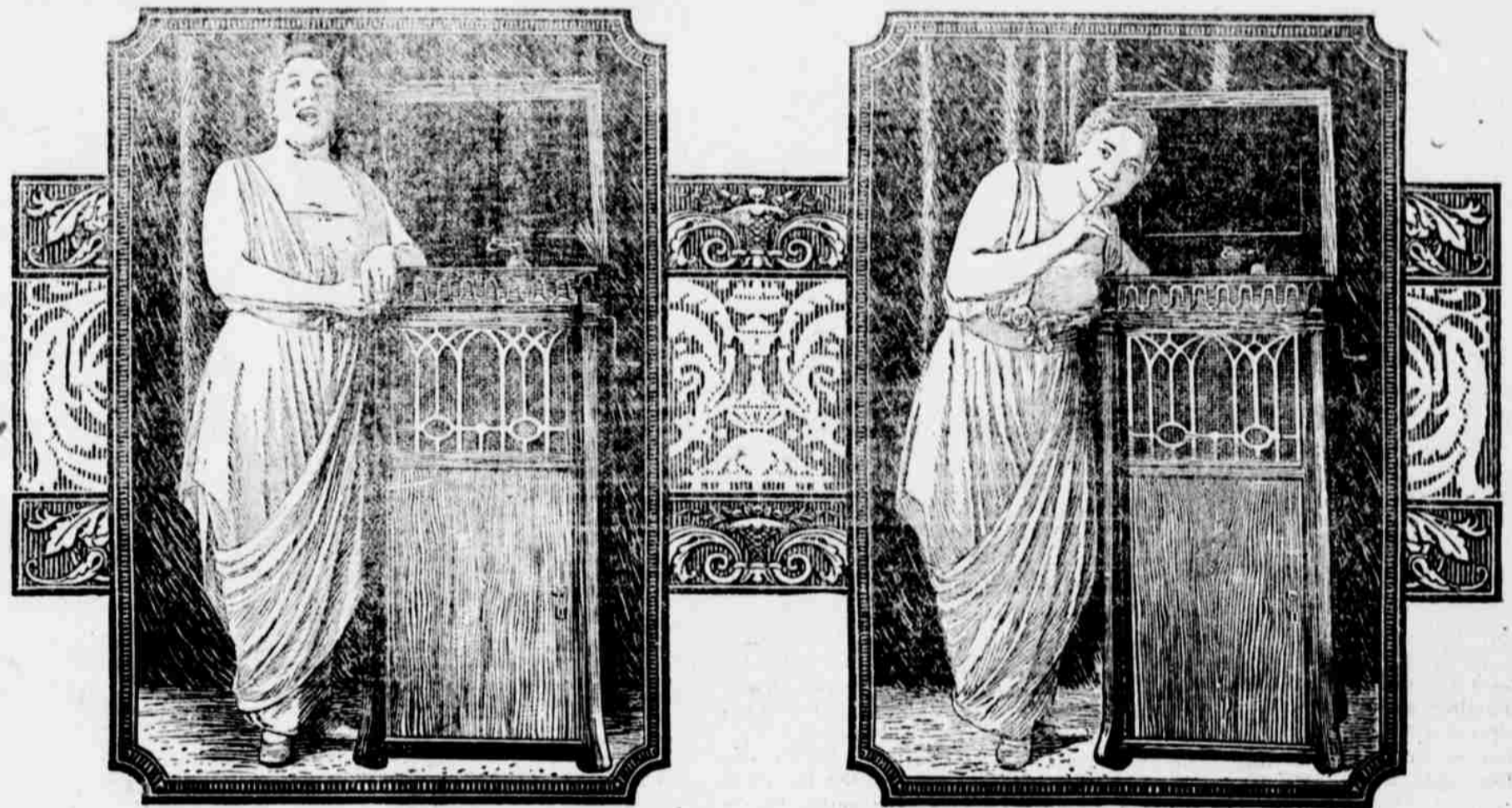
As Others See Him
