SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON FOR MAY 23 ISRAEL'S FIRST KING. LESSON TEXT—1 Sam. 9:15-16:23. GOLDEN TEXT—Only fear the Lord, and serve him in truth with all your heart.

I. The People Demand a King (vv. 8:1-9). 1. Their reasons for this demand. (1) Samuel was incapacitated by old age; (2) the unfaithfulness of his sons...

II. Samuel Tells of the Manner of the Kings (vv. 10-18). He shows them that the king will be very exacting and arbitrary in his dealing with them.

III. Samuel's Protest Disregarded by the People (vv. 10-22). Having made up their minds they deliberately shut their eyes to the truth and rushed madly into the experiment.

IV. The King Provisionally Pointed Out (1:10-13). Saul was sent by his father to search for the asses that had wandered away.

V. The King Chosen at Mizpeh (10:17-27). The Lord had already pointed out to Samuel who should be king and Saul had been anointed. Let us observe:

1. Why Saul was chosen. If they would have a king the Lord would give them the one best suited to fill the place. He was from Benjamin, a small tribe, which would prevent undue rivalry between Ephraim and Judah...

2. How Saul was chosen. The method was by lot. Samuel called them together before the Lord, and before the lot was cast he again remonstrated with them against such action.

3. How the king was received by the people. Saul knew that the Lord had chosen him, but through modesty and fear he shrank from the responsibility.

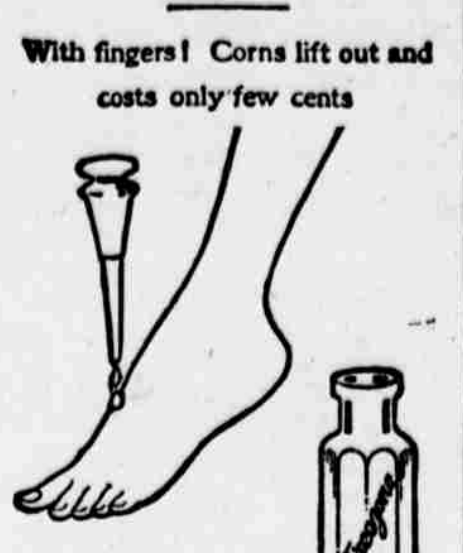
VI. The King Confirmed at Gilgal (ch. 11).
