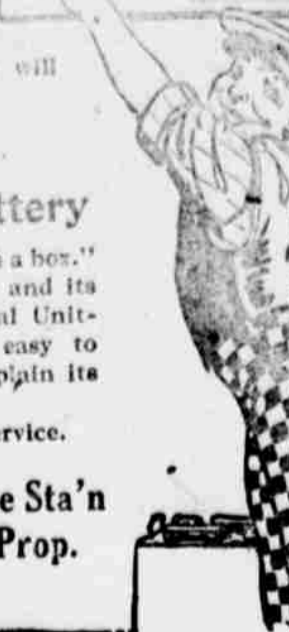

C. C. McConkey returned to the Soldiers' Home at Grand Island Wednesday after visiting his daughter, Mrs. Rich Lippincott.

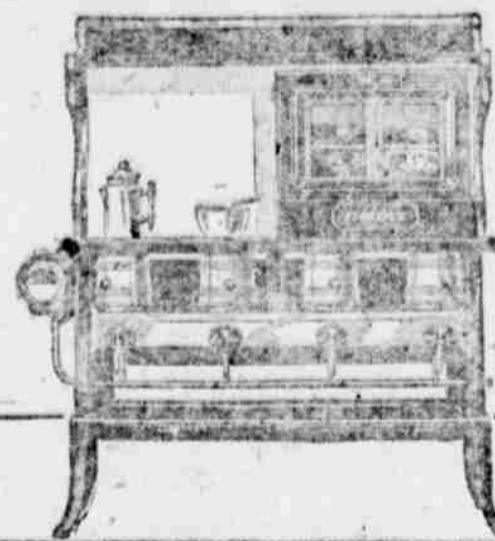

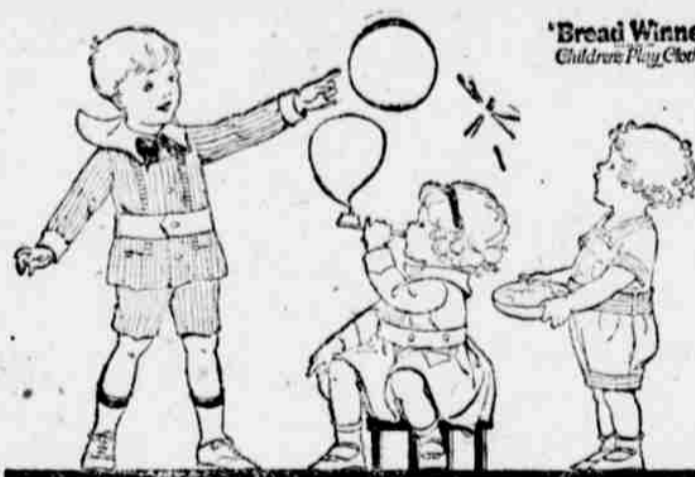
